## ***1192<sup>st</sup> meeting, August 26, 2015***

Jeff Shevlin presented his talk, **So-Called Dollars Panama Pacific International Exposition - 1915.**

The PPIE spawned a rich variety of so-called dollars starting with the official medal designed by Robert Aiken to medals struck to help underwrite state participation, the so-called state fund dollars.

State fund dollars included the aluminum Arkansas dollar-sized medal, the only aluminum so-called dollar struck for the exposition. Most of the other participating states struck their medals in bronze with rare silver-plated examples. Florida is the only state medal usually found silver-plated and rare in bronze. The North Carolina Exposition Fund so-called dollar is the key to the series.

Although not included among the state fund dollars, researchers have overlooked the fact that the so-called Baroque Shield dollar is actually the Nebraska state seal and should be included in the state series.

California itself is represented by several medals with a variation of the state seal showing the exposition grounds coupled with a ship passing through the canal or the Tower of Jewels.

Twenty-six basic varieties, not counting metal; finish; plating; or minor die varieties, would make a basic collection of PPIE so-called dollars. Several are rare, but the North Carolina fund dollar is the only truly elusive medal.

### ***Exhibits:***

Michael shared an unlisted bronze Midwinter so-called dollar and HK 641, the 1897 San Francisco City Hall so-called dollar.

Bob shared two medals with themes currently involved in national controversies. The first is the 1970 Stone Mountain Memorial national commemorative medal, currently a theme involved in controversies over the Confederate flag. The second was the 1963 Padre Junipero Serra national commemorative medal, currently in the news because of the controversial decision to canonize him during the Pope's visit to the U.S.

Federico shared a Panamanian numismatic book that includes coins and medals of the PPIE, a Nicaraguan medal, a New Mexico token with bad Spanish text, and an unidentified token from either Texas or Mexico.

Bill exhibited a rare vulcanite Pacific Ocean House saloon token from Santa Cruz and an unlisted so-called dollar promoting the proposed state of Absaroka.
